

BASIC TRAINING OF PROBATIONARY SUB-INSPECTORS (EXECUTIVE) OF DELHI POLICE ACCORDING TO STANDING ORDER NO. HRD/39/2024

INTRODUCTION

Standing Order No. HRD/39/2024 prescribes the basic training programme for directly recruited **Probationary Sub-Inspectors (Executive)** of Delhi Police.

The training is intended to make the Sub-Inspectors professionally competent and capable of dealing with colleagues and citizens in a sensitive, legally and administratively correct manner.

The Standing Order gives emphasis not only to the legal aspects of police work but also to practical policing, scientific aids, investigation, intelligence gathering, forensic science and law & order duties.

OBJECTIVES OF TRAINING

(The principal objectives are):

- To impart knowledge of criminal laws and police practical work.
- To impart knowledge of modern methods of investigation.
- To impart basic knowledge of computers.
- To develop appropriate attitude towards work and society.
- To develop overall personality for undertaking greater responsibilities.
- To equip trainees with technical and professional skills.
- To improve physical strength and endurance.

The syllabus incorporates the new criminal laws, namely **BNS, BNSS and BSA**, while relevant provisions of the earlier laws are also discussed for working knowledge and handling of previously registered cases.

DURATION AND STRUCTURE

The training is of **02 years** and is conducted as an integrated programme comprising three semesters:

Semester-I – 06 months:

Basic indoor and outdoor training at Delhi Police Academy, including mid-term examination and break.

Semester-II – 06 months:

Basic indoor and outdoor training at Delhi Police Academy, final examination, Basic Commando & Bomb Disposal Training and preparation for Passing Out Parade.

Semester-III – 12 months:

Field Training in Districts through **A, B, C & D Courses**.

TRAINING COMPONENTS

The training comprises:

- Outdoor Training – **600 marks**
- Indoor Training – **1,650 marks**
- Specialized Training (Commando & BDS) – **100 marks**
- Field Training – A, B, C & D Courses

OUTDOOR TRAINING

Outdoor training is aimed at physical fitness, discipline, reflexes and practical police skills.

It includes:

- Physical Training
- Drill
- Crowd Control
- Unarmed Combat & First Aid
- Field Craft
- Weapon Training
- Wireless Communication
- Yoga
- Games
- Motor Transport Training
- Traffic Signals

6. SPECIALIZED TRAINING

The specialized training consists of **Commando and Bomb Disposal Course**, including commando activities, physical training, firing practice and basic bomb disposal training.

7. FIELD TRAINING

The field training is to provide practical exposure to actual police functioning.

Particular emphasis is placed on practical writing work, including:

- Drafting of FIR
- Lodging of DD entries
- Writing of case diaries
- Preparation of arrest memos
- Preparation of search memos

- Preparation of charge-sheets
- Attendance at TIP proceedings
- Recording of statements under Section 183 BNSS
- Preparation/handling of Kalandra under relevant provisions of BNSS and Delhi Police Act

The field training is conducted in Districts through the prescribed **A, B, C & D Courses**.

A trainee who has not qualified in the Indoor and Outdoor examinations and has not passed out from Delhi Police Academy is not permitted to commence the field courses.

GUIDANCE AND PROGRESS

Trainees are placed under designated **Course Guides**, who are responsible for personal guidance and continuous monitoring of their professional development, discipline and overall conduct.

Weekly interactive sessions are also prescribed for monitoring the progress of trainees.

ATTENDANCE

A minimum of **90% attendance in indoor/outdoor periods is compulsory**. The Standing Order provides specific provisions for extra classes, re-batching and further training in cases where the prescribed attendance is not achieved.

OVERALL

The training under HRD/39/2024 is a comprehensive **two-year integrated training programme**, combining classroom instruction, outdoor training, specialized commando/BDS training and extensive field training. The principal objective is to develop Sub-Inspectors who are legally competent, professionally skilled, physically fit and capable of independently performing investigation, law & order, preventive and supervisory police duties.
